## **Pre-Planning a Funeral Basics**

- 1. Choose one person that will facilitate and organize your funeral.
- 2. Obtain funeral insurance and / or open a bank account for this purpose.
- 3. Decide what documentation is necessary and properly secure and store documents. Write down all of the following choices and include them with the documentation.
- 4. Inform a loved one or "agent" where all of the important documents are located, especially your will and insurance policies. Grant this person full access to the documents, which could be in a safe deposit box, or a home safe, or at your attorney's office.
- 5. Choose a Funeral Home (after cost comparison)
- 6. Choose where you wish to be buried.
  - \*in your current town or your hometown
  - \*in a church / temple cemetery or a commercial cemetery or veteran's cemetery
- 7. Buy / secure a burial plot.
- 8. Compile a contact list of people that need to be notified of your passing.
  - \*old military buddies, school friends, lodge & country club friends, family and friends living outside of the country, etc.
- 9. Choose the clothing that you wish to wear for the burial.
- 10. Choose the location to hold your service.
- 11. Decide who will speak, sing, and provide the eulogy at the service.
- 12. Choose if you want to receive flowers or have a donation to your favorite charity. Some people find the gifting of flowers to be wasteful.
- 13. Have your obituary written or at a minimum have the highlights of your life prepared and organized.
- 14. Choose a photo for your funeral program.
